**1973-74**

The boys' cross country team was called the "most talented team in Niles West history" as they not only won the division, but also the Central Suburban League championship.

**1978-79**

The girls' basketball team won the very first Illinois basketball state championship. The team featured current physical education teacher Rebecca Tuecke.

**1979-80**

Niles East High School was closed, and the students were dispersed among Niles North and Niles West.

**1981-82**



The first senior assembly, which was held to recognize the success of the senior class, was held on Oct. 29.

**1985-86**

West hosted an event called Run for Liberty to raise money for the restoration of New York City's Statue of Liberty. All proceeds went directly to the restoration.

**1986-87**

In order to explore new cultures, West founded the Korean and Chinese clubs. Also new to West, the Nighthawks, a combined Niles West and North hockey team, ended the season with an overall record of 18-13-8 and placed second in state overall.



**1988-89**


After five years of no girls' varsity tennis team, head coach Bob Farrington led the team to compete at the varsity level. They finished fourth in conference that year.

**1989-90**

Niles West was introduced to the enhanced ACT assessment that contained English, Math, Science Reasoning and Reading. Most West students approved of the changes.

**1992-93**

Physical education and health teacher Judi Sloan was the first physical education teacher to be awarded the Illinois State Teacher of the Year.



**1993-94**

School board member Gail Stone had the honor of cutting the ribbon to open the new science wing.

**1994-95**

Teachers go on strike for two weeks due to unsuccessful negotiations with administrations.

**1997-98**

Eleven classes were introduced to Niles West including: AP psychology, journalism, photojournalism and advanced physics. The student body also held their first annual Halloween costume contest.

**1998-99**

Gym leaders were introduced as a part of gym classes.

**1999-00**

The community voted on a referendum for a new wing in the school.

**2000-01**

The varsity cheerleading team led by coach Mindy Slutzky went to Orlando, FL, to compete at the national level.

**2001-02**

Senior Dan Rybalko won state for diving. Also that year, West changed its mascot from the Indian to the Wolf.

**2002-03**

Construction at Niles West brought about a new cafeteria for students.

**2003-04**

The track and field team, led by coach Mark Egofske, won its first conference title.

**2004-05**

The mod schedule was replaced by nine periods that are 42 minutes each. Also this year, the Literacy Center opened.
